- 4 Māori performing arts bracket refers to a combination of items including whakaeke, waiata, waiata-ā-ringa, poi, haka, whakamutunga/whakawātea.

## Elements and performance criteria

### Element 1

Perform a Māori performing arts bracket.

Rangemay include but is not limited to at least four of – whakaeke, waiata, waiata-ā-ringa, poi, haka, whakamutunga/whakawātea.

### Performance criteria

- 1.1 Performance incorporates iwi variation with regard to movement, voice and pronunciation.
